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The state board of accountancy is the one which evaluates your preparedness to go ahead and take the CPA examination. If they make this decision, they'll provide you with a Notice to Schedule, or an NTS. After getting this NTS, you could plan on when to go ahead and take the examination. You really should get in touch with the Prometric Services so that you can set your time and your selected section for the CPA examination. You'll have to choose the date, the time in addition to the place for the exam. You could also schedule the examination via the internet or even via the telephone.

Each year, you've got 4 testing periods of time which you could choose from. There are January, February, April, May, July, August, and October, November. Available exam days may vary dependant upon your area. For some places, they are typically available six days per week, allowing you to pick a more suitable time for you.

You will select which of the four sections you want to write. You can do any of them in any specific test window, however if you fail an area, you cannot re-sit for it in the exact same time window. There is another rule that does apply to those who go ahead and take CPA examination: you have 18 months to pass all 4 sections, the clock will begin ticking from the moment whenever you pass the 1st section.

Instead of taking multiple sections in the same window, it'll be considerably better to spread them equally. It is of general consensus that you need to study for three months to get ready for each section, which makes it a bad idea to take more than 1 portion of the examination in 1 test window, unless you've recently graduated from college or university and still remember the majority of of the material that you've learned.

Because of the fact that a span of only eighteen months is given to pass the 4 sections of the examination, it'll considerably better to take the sections that you find the most difficult first. Naturally, which sections are the most difficult is something which every individual will need to determine on their own.

The very best thing to do is to organize the sections determined by which one is the most hard to the easiest 1 for you. If sadly, you failed one of the 4 sections, reschedule it immediately to the following window. That way, the information you have obtained will not be squandered..

The CPA examination is something that is quite well known for being hard.
